First Peoples

First peoples are the **indigenous** peoples of the world. They are descended from the first people to live in their land.

There are more than 370 million indigenous people in the world, belonging to 5000 people groups, from every continent except Antarctica. They belong to thousands of nations or tribes, many with their own language and customs.

European nations sent ships all over the world between the 1400s and the 1700s. People from countries such as Great Britain, France, Spain and Portugal landed throughout Africa, Oceania, Asia and the Americas. They set up colonies and penal settlements. They took the land, food, gold and silver they found, usually by force. They introduced diseases that killed millions of
